Polling was conducted online from March 28- April 2, 2024. Using Dynamic Online Sampling to attain a representative sample, Embold Research polled 1567 registered voters nationwide. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, education, region, and 2020 presidential vote.
